




EQUITABLE EMPOWERMENT IN GEORGIA

Helen Bradbury is a development professional and long term resident of Georgia committed to integrated and equitable sustainable development which enriches rural and urban lives.

Her career spans market system approaches to solving problems ranging from the welfare of working horses in Ethiopia and natural resource based livelihoods in the Middle East, to early economic recovery in post-tsunami Indonesia. She is Team Leader of the Swiss Development Cooperation's long running Alliances Programme, Mercy Corps flagship market systems programme in Georgia which starting in 2008 has impacted over 600,000 rural households across Georgia in dairy, meat, wool and honey sectors. Its next four year phase has a regional and international focus looking at cross border linkages, trade and export with Armenia, Azerbaijan and beyond. Helen advises on market systems development and

women's economic empowerment (WEE) and has a strong interest in applying market systems thinking with government and operationalizing gender and WEE at scale with Alliances serving as a case study in a global community of practice for generating practical working methods for making this happen.



Tamar Chugoshvili is the First Vice-Speaker of the Parliament of Georgia and the Head of the Gender Equality Council of the Parliament.

A young Georgian politician with valuable education background in Law and public Administration. After gaining experience in the civil sector working in leading positions in non-governmental organizations, she worked with the Prime Minister of Georgia on Human Rights and Gender Equality Issues. She extended her knowledge on equal participation in decision making process' in Harvard Kennedy School while taking the course on Women's Participation in Politics. Tamar took part in developing the first national strategy and Governmental action plan on human rights protection in 2014. During the same period, she served as Government's focal point to the EU Special Representative to Georgia on Legal and Constitutional Reforms and Human Rights.



George Kekelidze is a writer, poet and essayist, who has contributed much to the popularization of books and has given new life to library culture in Georgia. Since March 2012 he has been Director of the National Parliamentary Library

In 2015 he published his most popular book Guruli Diary which became a bestseller. A special tour was established in Guria region based on the book, the Route of the Guruli Diary.

Giorgi has led a modernization process of Georgian libraries, created the Digital National Photo Gallery of old photos and opened new libraries in rural areas of the country, as well as Georgian library corners in Istanbul, Kiev and Vienna.

In addition to his main job, George is a presenter of various literary-critical programs literary columnist and founder of weekly art-events. He delivers lectures on classical literature and the history of art in several universities of the country. George is a founder of charity fund, unifying students and leading educational and social activities.



Giorgi Bakradze – is an economist, thinker, lecturer, advisor of the President of the National Bank of Georgia and board member of computer literacy community.

Giorgi is a preeminent intellectual best known from the TV game: What Where When. He has an incredible mind holding knowledge on wide variety of topics in science, literature, music, cinematography, information technologies etc.

Giorgi Bakradze has an MA in Economics from Williams College, USA and from Georgetown University and an MSc in Physics from Tbilisi State University. Over the years he has extended his professional knowledge (attending seminars) in the world's leading economic institutions: in the Bank of England, Banque de France, Swiss National Bank, Joint Vienna Institute, IMF Institute, etc. He is an author of numerous scientific works, research and publications. Since 2004 he has been a lecturer at

top Georgian universities. Giorgi has a significant experience of working in the public sector as well as with the non-government sector, starting his professional career in a World Bank project for the development of municipal services.



Lia Nadaraia – is a Gender Expert and is the director of the Women's Political Resource Center, the Chairperson of the South Caucasus Women's Congress and the President of the Caucasian Feminist Initiative. In 2014 she was elected as a member of the Committee on the Elimination of Discrimination against Women (CEDAW).

For two decades she has worked on gender equality issues supporting women's participation and initiatives though educational work, publications and events aimed at raising awareness on Women and Local Governance, Gender, Politics and Law and Election issues. The Anti-Domestic Violence Law (2006), Gender Equality Concept of the State, the Gender Equality Law (2010) and a number of legislative recommendations concerning the need to increase women's representation in decision-making and politics-is a short list of the topics she works on.

Ketevan Bochorishvili is the Deputy Minister of Economy and Sustainable Development of Georgia

Ketevan gained a Master's degree in International Public Management in Milan, Italy. She started gaining experience and leadership skills when she was a student and her first job was with American Councils for International Education. Later she continued her career in the Millennium Challenge Georgia Fund, then in management consulting company in Rome, Italy and in 2010-2012 worked as a Director of Invest in Georgia, at the National Investment Agency.

Since 2012 she has been the Deputy Minister of Economy and Sustainable Development of Georgia and one of the main figures leading several successful programmes for supporting economic development of the country such as Produce in Georgia that benefited more than 200 enterprises to date.



Tamar Khulordava is the Chairperson of the Committee on European Integration of the Parliament of Georgia and the member of the Gender Equality Council of the Parliament.

Tamar has gained education at several European and American universities: in 1995 she won US Government's Future Leaders Exchange Program Scholarship and studied in Hartford High School of State of Wisconsin, USA. Afterwards she graduated Tbilisi State University and obtained qualification of a lawyer. In 2014, she raised her qualification within the program Transparent Public Administration and Management in Lund University, Sweden. She has also passed the lawyer qualification exams in civil law and prosecutor qualification exam in criminal law.

Before being elected in the parliament of Georgia, she was a First Deputy Minister of Corrections, she also worked as a lawyer at the EU Delegation in Georgia and a at American Bar Association as well. Together with it she leaded the number of professional training courses in Procedural Skills, Legal Spelling and Legal ethics for the students of the universities and the members of Bar Association of Georgia.



Dimitri Tskitishvili is a member of the parliament of Georgia, Deputy Chairman of the Foreign Relations Committee, the member of the Gender Equality Council and also the member of the Human Rights and Civil Integration Committee.

He gained a master's degree of Art in International Studies, Foreign Policy in the University of Wyoming, USA. During several years he had been a Vice President of the International Union of Socialist Youth (IUSY) and coordinated Black Sea regional cooperation issues.

Dimitri is a member of the political party Georgian Dream and manages international relations of the party with European political parties and organizations.

He is a lecturer and leads the course of Foreign Policy Analysis at Law, Social Sciences and Diplomacy School of Georgian-American University for the students of Master's level.



Duta Skhirtladze is an actor, showman and TV personality with good sense of humor whose popularity has spanned more than two decades.

He was born and spent his childhood in Kakheti, Telavi municipality and always tries to express his love and interest toward countryside life and the rural population publicly.

He started career as a theatre actor and worked in Rustaveli National Theatre, in Theatric Basement and currently he is an actor at Marjanishvili State Academic Drama Theatre. Besides his theatrical career he has starred in up to 20 movies.



Paata Khizanishvili is a State Representative-Governor of Kvemo Kartli Region. His career is mainly linked to finances, administration, education and policy. For the past several years he had been working at different decision making positions at Cartu Bank JSC. Previously, he also worked on the managerial positions at several ministries.

Mr. Khizanishvili is a practitioner psychologist and has many years of working experience in education: he worked as a Head of the Operative Psychology Department at the Academy of the Ministry of State Security of Georgia, where he gained a substantial teaching experience.


Working with the Rules: Gender and Governance: Women's Access to Decision Making


In 2011 a pilot project was started in Tsalka, Dmanisi and Tetritskaro Municipalities aiming to grant access to women to public goods in local government, to pensions, consultation, benefits and to make them feel welcome in the government building. Three municipally run women's rooms were opened and village representatives trained in how to include women in community meetings. Five years on in these three regions the percentage of women's participation at community meetings has increased from 3-5% to up to 30%.


17 rural Women's Rooms (The Women's Room is a new municipal service, open and free information-consultation space for the rural population, especially women) open to women and men have been opened in 17 municipalities, two urban Women's Rooms have opened in Rustavi and Batumi linking town to country, with 9000 visitors, 38% of whom are men. The establishment of Women's Rooms were funded by SDC (in 9 municipalities) and by USAID (in 10 municipalities). The rooms are used regularly for community based functions, for the library and consultation with the women's rooms managers and up to 1800 rural women have accessed skills training in Language courses, computer lessons, business plan writing and business management.

30 MOU's have been signed between the women's rooms and NGO's and organisations who wish to reach rural people equitably. 350 village representatives have been trained, dozens of women have started or upgraded small businesses in rural areas, and 68 women's initiated community initiatives voted on in community meetings or initiated through women's rooms were funded by the local governments to the value of 266,651 USD. 19 business plans from mountainous Ajara were funded by Produce in Georgia to a value of 57,000 USD.









Projects initiated by women:
Children's playgrounds, heating and water systems for village kindergartens, community libraries, water

and sanitary systems renovation.









Working with the Rules: Gender and Governance: Women's Access to Decision Making

Entry Point: The local government is a key market player. The gender analysis revealed that women lacked access to decision making fora at both community level and municipal level. Furthermore, Gender Laws brought into effect in 2010 for municipalities which included measures such as gender sensitive budgeting, were not being enacted at the municipal level. Women are key actors in the livestock value chain in a wide range of roles and responsibilities in livestock husbandry. Fully inclusive and representational decisions cannot be made without their voices, perspectives and experiences.

Intervention at a Glance

Name: Women's Access to Decision Making and Women's Room

Description: A new municipal service a library and resource space for rural women and children who visit the municipal building, facilitated by local government, local women and civil society. The "Women's Room" – is the focal point of an intervention which aims to improve the access of rural women to local government and decision making processes in tandem with the work being done to mainstream national gender policy requirements into local government.

Date started: February, 2012

Key Constraints: Women's restricted participation in decision making in municipal and local fora.

Programme Entry Point: Facilitation with local government to develop guidelines and training for local government representatives with a focal point provided by a 'Women's Room' in each municipal building offering a resource space and informational services for rural women

What we did: Gender Survey conducted, key constraints identified; meetings for implementing the 2010 Gender Equality Law at the municipal level held; linkages facilitated between the "Women's Room" staff member and private/NGO sector to ensure the efficiency of the informational flow and resources for Women's Room. TOT Training course for the "Women's Room" staff members developed for training of village reps, provision of practical guidelines/toolkits on Gender Equality and Good Governance to municipal and Village Reps.
